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General Waiver Application

Public Water Systems are required to monitor for certain types of contaminants. A Waiver can reduce or eliminate these requirements. In order to qualify for a Waiver, an assessment must be performed to determine if the Public Water System is vulnerable to a contaminant category. Waivers are issued where appropriate to reduce or eliminate monitoring at one or more sources, represented by an Entry Point (EP). If an EP is changed, the waiver is still in effect however; how a waiver is applied at the new EP must be re-evaluated with respect to the sources covered by the waiver.
